Note:

- No more than 180 points (12 courses) from Stage I courses (includes General Education Courses if done as Stage I).
- At least 180 points (12 courses) must be above Stage I.
- 30 points (2 courses) must be taken from the General Education Schedule (not eligible to take courses in Schedules D, E, F).
- STATS 10X or BIOSCI 209 may count as 15 points towards the '45 points further in courses listed in the BSc schedule' if Year I elective was POPLHLTH 111.
- STATS 101G will not count towards General Education requirements.
- Only 15 points (1 course) may be taken from outside the Faculty. POPLHLTH 111 is out of Faculty.
- Students attempting to qualify for Honours must take 6 courses at Stage III.

It is the student's responsibility to check that the final programme complies with University Regulations. The Faculty of Science is the final authority on all BSc regulations.
